The University Department of Environmental Health and Safety will oversee all hazmat analysis, abatement, monitoring and disposal.

1.1 HAZMAT

A. HAZMAT includes but is not limited to:

1. Asbestos
2. Lead paint
3. Chemically contaminated soil, groundwater and debris
4. Laboratory and Bulk Chemicals Other miscellaneous chemicals Biohazardous / Infectious Materials Radioactive Materials
5. Equipment known or suspected of containing HAZMAT Fluorescent Light Bulbs
6. Ballasts or fluorescent light fixtures
7. Computer and Electronic Equipment (any material with a printed circuit board or cathode ray tube)
8. PCB's

B. The work may include the following:

1. Sampling and analysis
2. Preparation of project scope, drawings and specifications
3. Specification of Safety Requirements
4. Regulatory notifications Permit application Bidding and negotiation Monitoring of abatement
5. Proper disposal and removal
6. Regulatory reporting and documentation
